The Association des grand-parents du Québec (AGPQ) continued its various activities over the past year and continued to offer its services to the Quebec population. It is with the maintenance of the helpline and by organizing legal information sessions, coffee-meetings, conferences, and other local, regional and provincial representations that the organization has once again distinguished itself fervently to represent its members and people in need.

The activities of the AGPQ were in this way in response to the mission and objectives it has set for itself and listed as follows:

Promote and defend the rights of grandchildren to maintain meaningful relationships with their grandparents (and extended family).

Help grandparents and seniors experiencing difficulties in a family context.

Sensitize the authorities to the problems encountered.

Promote recognition of the importance of the role of grandparents and elders in society and with families and grandchildren.

Defend the rights of older victims of abuse or exploitation.

Encourage intergenerational encounters.

Help grandchildren and families to better understand their origins (be the memory of families).

#### **Crisis line**

The helpline was very helpful once again this year and still represents the "gateway" to the Association for many grandparents who are experiencing difficulties. The crisis line has been maintained over 4000 hours of availability thanks to a few dedicated volunteers. On this subject, it would have been impossible to be so "attentive" without the contribution of our warmest second-line service workers, Ms. Monic Avoine and Ms. Micheline Drouin. It should be noted that grandparents' calls come from all regions of Quebec. The number of calls is estimated at nearly 1000 per year. People who join the AGPQ have multiple relational and communication needs and the volunteers who listen to them have developed a solid psychosocial experience over time.

#### **Coffee meetings**

Particular attention has been paid to creating and presenting themes that interest and touch the grandparents of Quebec. The coffee meetings are in place to provide a place for reflection and are supervised by speakers who encourage participants to express themselves and share their experiences as a group.

Several meetings were organized in the Capitale-Nationale in the presence of speakers from the social field (psychologist, psychoeducator, social work, and specialized training). André Dulac, Maryse Cyr, Armande Duval, Nathalie Faure, Annie Bergeron and Alexandre Lambert are part of the team of facilitators who enhanced the content of these meetings presented during a spring and fall session in Beauport. The participation of those present at the coffee meetings was encouraged and some people enjoyed these moments with regularity.

#### **Political Representations**

In addition to offering services to the Quebec population, the AGPQ has continued to represent its members across the province on various political issues over the past year.

In particular, the AGPQ has made a representation to the Ministère des Services sociaux et des Aînés regarding certain discriminations and/or injustices suffered by grandparents who have custody of their grandchildren in relation to their parents. Following these claims pleaded by the organization and its members, the Minister asked his officials to provide him with a portrait of the grandparents who have custody of their grandchildren. In this sense, it is an issue that the AGPQ will closely monitor over the next year.

The AGPQ also continued to raise awareness among the stakeholders concerned about Bill 47, which was introduced in the Quebec National Assembly last July: An Act to amend the Civil Code and other legislative provisions relating to adoption, parental authority and the disclosure of information. With regard to this bill, the AGPQ claims the right of grandchildren to maintain a relationship with their biological grandparents in the event of intra-family adoption, as well as in the event of an adoption being placed under the Youth Protection Act.

The Association sat on the organizing committee of the Table de Concertation des Aînés de la Capitale Nationale during a thematic day entitled "Les grandparents: Role, point of view on the family and society, situation and problems". The Association also mobilized on the adoption bill during a question period in the National Assembly. This bill will be considered by the next elected government. Also on the subject of adoption, the AGPQ advised FADOQ on how to assert the rights of grandparents in relation to the time of adoption.

Finally, the AGPQ presented its services at the Salon des aînés de Saint-George de Beauce. During this day, more than 600 people showed up at the organization's booth.

### The AGPQ: internship

Since last year, the AGPQ has welcomed university students in social work from Laval University as interns in intervention. At a rate of about three hours per week, students participate concretely and personally in the social action of telephone listening. Through this type of involvement, students contribute to the organization's activities and the pursuit of its mission. By welcoming students to its community environment, the Association des grandparents contributes to the training of Quebec social workers.



### Hours of listening services and number of hours worked by volunteers

The AGPQ has a team of dedicated volunteers who, over the past year, have accumulated more than 7000 hours during its activities. The crisis line service is available 12 hours a day, 360 days a year. This service alone represents more than 4000 hours of listening and referencing.
